SCHEDULE

Infectious diseases

In exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 146 of the Public Health Act and all other enabling powers, the Government has made the following Order—

Title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Notifiable Diseases Order 2017.

Commencement.

2. This Order comes into force on the day of publication.

Notifiable diseases.

3. The infectious diseases listed in the Schedule to this Order are notifiable diseases for the purposes of Part IV of the Public Health Act and except as is provided for in paragraph 4, the provisions of Part IV shall apply in respect of those diseases.

Revocation of Notifiable Diseases Order 1993.

4. The Notifiable Diseases Order 1993 is revoked.
