GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

ISSUE OF "PENNY BLACK" COIN NOTICE, 1990.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Governor has issued the following notice—

Title.

- 1. This notice may be cited as the "Penny Black" Coin Notice, 1990. Issue of new coins.
- 2. (1) New coins of platinum, gold, silver and cupro-nickel in the denomination of one Crown and thereof, shall be made.
 - (2) In the making of the said coins the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Part 2 of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.
 - (3) In the making of the said coins a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Schedule.

Design of the coins.

- 3. The design of the coins authorised by this notice shall be as follows—
 - (a) all coins shall bear on the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II with the inscription "ELIZABETH II" to the left and the inscription "GIBRALTAR" and the date of the year to the right;
 - (b) the reverse impression shall bear the following design—

A representation of the Penny Black Stamp with a portrait of Rowland Hill, Founder of the Penny Black Stamp, on one side and a portrait of Henry Corbould, who drew the profile of Queen Victoria on the Stamp, on the other side together with the inscription "150th Anniversary of the First Postage Stamp Gibraltar" and the value of the coin.

Legal tender.

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
