GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT 1990

ELECTRUM COIN NOTICE 2002

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Governor has issued the following notice-

Title.

1. This notice may be cited as the Electrum Coin Notice 2002.

Issue of new coins.

- 2.(1) New coins of gold and silver in the denomination of a Crown and denominations thereof shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness, or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

Design of the coins.

3. The design of the coins authorised by this notice shall be as follows-

(a) the coins shall bear on the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II with the inscription "ELIZABETH II" to the left and the inscription "GIBRALTAR" and the date of the year to the right;

(b) the reverse impression of the coins shall bear a design-

(i) depicting the head of Athena wearing a crested helmet taken from the Mysia Electrum coin (circa 520 BC) with the

inscription "ELECTRUM" together with the value of the coin; or

(ii) depicting the heads of a lion and a bull facing one another taken from the Kroisos Electrum coin (circa 560 BC) with the inscription "ELECTRUM" together with the value of the coin; or

(iii) depicting the head of Hercules with his head clad in a lion's skin taken from the Lesbos Electrum coin (480 – 450 BC) with the inscription "ELECTRUM" together with the value of the coin; or

(iv) depicting the front half of a winged horse taken from the Lampsakos Electrum coin (circa 450 BC) with the inscription "ELECTRUM" together with the value of the coin.

Legal Tender.

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
