GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

ISSUE OF THE 100 YEARS OF NAVAL AVIATION COIN COLLECTION NOTICE 2009

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for Finance has issued the following notice—

Title.

1. This notice may be cited as the Issue of the 100 Years of Naval Aviation Coin Collection Notice 2009.

Issue of new coins.

2.(1) New coins of gold, silver, cupro-nickel and silver-plated cupro-nickel in the denomination of £10, £5, £1 and One Crown shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Part II and Part III of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standards weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

Design of the coins.

3. The design of the coins authorised by this notice shall be as follows—

- (a) the coins shall bear on the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II with the inscription “ELIZABETH II” to the left and the inscription “GIBRALTAR” and the date of the year to the right;

- (b) the reverse impression shall bear–
- (i) a design featuring a British Naval Fighter aircraft that first flew in 1956. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.
 - (ii) a design featuring a single seater biplane fighter aircraft used during the First World War. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.
 - (iii) a design featuring a Torpedo Spotter Reconnaissance biplane dive-bomber – most commonly known for its role in the Battle of Taranto in 1940. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.
 - (iv) a design featuring a low level strike aircraft, entering service in 1962. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.
 - (v) a design featuring a British carrier-based torpedo-bomber biplane. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.
 - (vi) a design featuring an aircraft widely used as patrol over the North Sea until the end of the war. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.
 - (vii) a design featuring one of the most successful fighters of WWII. The inscriptions include 100 Years of

Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of coin.

- (viii) a design featuring a helicopter used mainly for communications, Search and Rescue. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of coin.
- (ix) a design featuring a naval jet fighter, reconnaissance and attack aircraft. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.
- (x) a design featuring a British fighter aircraft developed for the Navy and was their last piston-engined fighter. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.
- (xi) a design featuring a British 2 seat bombing and torpedo carrying folder seaplane. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.
- (xii) A design featuring a two-seat jet fighter developed in the 1950's. The inscriptions include 100 Years of Naval Aviation, the Fly Navy Logo plus the individual name of the aircraft and the value of the coin.

Legal Tender.

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
