GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT 1990

**QUEEN ELIZABETH THE FIRST QUADRICENTENNIAL CROWN
COIN NOTICE 2003**

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Governor has issued the following notice—

Title.

1. This notice may be cited as Queen Elizabeth the First Quadricentennial Crown Coin Notice 2003.

Issue of new coins.

2.(1) New coins of platinum, gold, silver and cupro nickel in the denomination of a Crown and denominations thereof shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness, or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

Design of the coins.

3. The design of the coins authorised by this notice shall be as follows—

- (a) the coins shall bear on the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II with the inscription “ELIZABETH II” to the left and the inscription “GIBRALTAR” and the date of the year to the right;
- (b) the reverse impression shall bear a design of—

- (i) the young Princess Elizabeth playing with a ball in front of The Old Palace, Hatfield, with the inscriptions “THE OLD PALACE HATFIELD” and “QUADRICENTENNIAL OF THE LIFE OF ELIZABETH 1558–1603” together with the value of the coin;
- (ii) Queen Elizabeth I in full regalia at her Coronation in 1559, with the inscriptions “CORONATION 1559” and “QUADRICENTENNIAL OF THE LIFE OF ELIZABETH I 1559–1603” together with the value of the coin;
- (iii) Queen Elizabeth I with Robert Dudley, Earl of Leicester at the kill of a deer with horse and hunting servants in the background with the inscription “QUADRICENTENNIAL OF THE LIFE OF QUEEN ELIZABETH I 1558–1603” together with the value of the coin;
- (iv) Queen Elizabeth I, watched by English soldiers and with part of the English Fleet in the background, arriving on her white horse at Tilbury to deliver her famous speech to the English Forces prior to the defeat of the Spanish Armada, with the inscriptions “TILBURY 1558 THE ARMADA SPEECH” and “QUADRICENTENNIAL OF THE LIFE OF ELIZABETH I 1558–1603” together with the value of the coin;
- (v) Queen Elizabeth I holding the Sceptre aboard a ship of the English Fleet, taken from the design on a Gold Ryal, with the inscriptions “GOLD RYAL 1583–1585” and “QUADRICENTENNIAL OF THE LIFE OF ELIZABETH I 1558–1603” together with the value of the coin;
- (vi) the Coat of Arms of Queen Elizabeth I with her signature “ELIZABETH R” below with the inscription “QUADRICENTENNIAL OF THE LIFE OF ELIZABETH I 1558–1603” together with the value of the coin.

Legal Tender.

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
