LEGAL NOTICE NO.129 OF 2018.

**GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990**

**ISSUE OF THE 100<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF THE ROYAL AIR FORCE  
PART TWO COIN NOTICE 2018**

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following notice–

**Title and commencement.**

1. This notice may be cited as the Issue of the 100th Anniversary of the Royal Air Force Part Two Coin Notice 2018 and shall come into operation on the day of publication.

**Issue of new coins.**

2.(1) New coins of gold, silver, cupro nickel and tombac in the denomination of One Crown, 1/10 Crown, ¼ Crown, ½ Crown and Double Crown shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

**Design of the coins.**

3. The design of the coins authorised by this notice shall be as follows–

- (a) the coins shall bear on the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II with the inscription “ELIZABETH II D G REGINA GIBRALTAR” bordering the top edge and the value and date of the year below;

- (b) the reverse impression shall bear a design split into four quarters by a four-bladed propeller with each segment including a different pilot uniform. The encircling inscription reads “ROYAL AIR FORCE 100 YEARS 1918-2018”;
- (c) the reverse impression shall bear a design of the British fighter plane of WWI, the Sopwith Camel, engaged in a dogfight with an Axis aircraft. The encircling inscription reads “SOPWITH CAMEL 1917-1922”;
- (d) the reverse impression shall bear a design of the Type O Heavy Bomber in action, Britain’s only heavy bomber used during World War I. The encircling inscription reads “TYPE O HEAVY BOMBER 1915-1922”;
- (e) the reverse impression shall bear a design of the Avro Vulcan in flight covered in its iconic camouflage paint scheme flying over enemy territory. The encircling inscription reads “AVRO VULCAN 1956-1984”;
- (f) the reverse impression shall bear a design of the Lancaster Bomber following a successful hit on the Mohne Dam. The encircling inscription reads “ROYAL AIR FORCE NO 617 SQUADRON THE DAMBUSTERS”;
- (g) the reverse impression shall bear a design of two Harrier Jump Jets. This aircraft has also been referred to as “the forgotten hero that won the (Falklands) war”. The encircling inscription reads “HARRIER JUMP JET 1967-2003”;
- (h) the reverse impression shall bear a design of a Sepecat Jaguar, a British-French jet attack aircraft flying over enemy territory. The encircling inscription reads “SEPECAT JAGUAR 1973-2007”;
- (i) the reverse impression shall bear a design of three Supermarine Spitfires flying above the English Channel. The Encircling inscription reads “SUPERMARINE SPITFIRE 1936-1961”;
- (j) the reverse impression shall bear a design of the Hawker Hurricane embroiled in a dogfight with the Luftwaffe high above the English countryside. The encircling inscription reads “HAWKER HURRICANE 1937-1944”;

- (k) the reverse impression shall bear a design of two Sea King Helicopters in full flight on a search and rescue mission. The encircling inscription reads “SEA KING HELICOPTER”;
- (l) the reverse impression shall bear a design of two Hercules Planes in flight. The encircling inscription reads “HERCULES C-130J C4/5”;
- (m) the reverse impression shall bear a design of three Hawk jets flying in formation high above the English countryside. The encircling inscription reads “HAWK JETS ADVANCED TRAINER AIRCRAFT”; and
- (n) the reverse impression shall bear a design of the F35B Lightning II on its altitude ascent following take off from an aircraft carrier. The encircling inscription reads “F35B LIGHTNING II”.

**Legal Tender.**

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
