LEGAL NOTICE NO. 097 OF 2019

GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

ISSUE OF THE ROYAL AIR FORCE – NORWEGIAN PILOTS COINS NOTICE 2019

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following Notice –

Title.

1. This Notice may be cited as the Issue of the Royal Air Force – Norwegian Pilots Coins Notice 2019.

Commencement.

2. This Notice shall come into operation on the day of publication.

Issue of new coins.

3.(1) New coins of cupro nickel, tombac and gold in the denominations of One Crown, Double Crown and Ten Pounds shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Parts II and III of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

Design of the coins.

4. The designs of the coins authorised by this Notice shall be as follows –

- (a) the coins shall bear on the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II with the inscription “ELIZABETH II D G REGINA GIBRALTAR” bordering the top edge, value and date of the year below;
- (b) the reverse impression shall bear a portrait of Ole Reistad looking up at the sky where Norwegian planes are training. The inscription “Little Norway” is depicted

above a crest. The inscription bordering the right side of the coin reads “LITTLE NORWAY, CANADA, TRAINING FOR VICTORY”;

- (c) the reverse impression shall bear a design depicting 3 Northrop-planes and a German submarine. The badge of Squadron 330 is also included. The inscription on the top left reads “NORWEGIAN RAF SQUADRON 330” and on the right “TRYGG HAVET” (translated to “SAFE WATERS”);
- (d) the reverse impression shall bear a design depicting three pilots with a Spitfire in the background. The RAF 331 squadron badge is depicted in the bottom right corner. The inscription on the top reads “NORWEGIAN RAF SQUADRON 331” and “FOR NORGE” at the bottom, translated to “FOR NORWAY”;
- (e) the reverse impression shall bear a design of a Spitfire pilot in his cockpit in action with three planes in the background and the RAF squadron 332 badge in the bottom left corner. The inscription from left to right reads “NORWEGIAN RAF SQUADRON 332. SAMHOLD I STRID” (translated to “UNITY IN COMBAT”);
- (f) the reverse impression shall bear a design depicting a close-up of the Catalina cockpit on patrol over the North Atlantic. The RAF 333 squadron badge is depicted in the bottom left. The inscription on the top left reads “FOR KONGE, FEDRELAND, OG FLAGGETS HEDER” (translated to “FOR KING, COUNTRY AND THE FLAG’S HONOUR”). On the bottom right the inscription reads “NORWEGIAN RAF SQUADRON 333”; and
- (g) the reverse impression shall bear a design depicting a silhouette of a Spitfire, stylised wings and a propeller. The inscription from top to the middle of it reads “IN GRATITUDE TO THE ROYAL AIRFORCE 1940-1945”.

Legal Tender.

- 5. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
