GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

ISSUE OF THE REMEMBRANCE 2020 COLLECTION –TOMB OF THE UNKNOWN SOLDIER COIN NOTICE 2021

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following notice-

Title and commencement.

1. This notice may be cited as the Issue of the Remembrance 2020 Collection – Tomb of the Unknown Soldier Coin Notice 2021 and shall come into operation on the day of publication.

Issue of new coins.

- 2.(1) New coins of gold in the denomination of fifty pence, one pound and five pounds shall be made.
- (2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be set out in Parts III and IX of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.
- (3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Parts of the Schedule.

Design of the coins.

- 3. The design of the coins authorised by this notice shall be as follows
 - (a) the coins shall bear on the obverse impression a design depicting the Gibraltar Coat of Arms with the Latin inscription "MONTIS INSIGNIA CALPE" together with the weight and metal fineness on either side of the coin. The inscription bordering the top edge reads "GIBRALTAR" with the value and date of the year below;
 - (b) the reverse design depicts an image of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Warsaw. A plaque is depicted beneath the image with an inscription that reads "TO AN UNKNOWN SOLDIER"; and

(c) the reverse design depicts an image of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in Warsaw. A plaque is depicted beneath the image with an inscription that reads "UNKNOWN SOLDIER WHO DIED FOR HIS HOMELAND".

Legal Tender.

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
