## GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

### ISSUE OF THE PRINCESS DIANA'S 60<sup>TH</sup> BIRTHDAY COINS NOTICE 2021

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following Notice—

#### **Title and commencement.**

1. This Notice may be cited as the Issue of the Princess Diana's 60<sup>th</sup> Birthday Coins Notice 2021 and comes into operation on the day of publication.

#### **Issue of new coins.**

2.(1) New coins of cupro nickel, humanium, silver and gold in the denominations of ½ crown, crown and two crowns/double crown shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

#### **Design of the coins.**

3. The design of the coins authorised by this notice shall be as follows –

- (a) the coins shall bear on the obverse impression the Gibraltar Coat of Arms with the inscription “ELIZABETH II D G REGINA GIBRALTAR 2021” bordering the edge and value shown below;
- (b) the reverse impression shall bear a black and white photographic portrait of Diana. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the ‘Forget-Me-Not’ with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads ‘DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT’ together with the inscription ‘THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS’ shown below;

- (c) the reverse impression shall bear a black and white photographic portrait of Diana wearing the Cambridge Lovers Knot tiara. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (d) the reverse impression shall bear a black and white photograph of Diana after the birth of her second child in September 1984. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (e) the reverse impression shall bear a colour photograph of Diana after the birth of her second child in September 1984. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (f) the reverse impression shall bear a black and white photograph of Diana meeting some children during an official royal visit. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (g) the reverse impression shall bear a colour photograph of Diana meeting some children during an official royal visit. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (h) the reverse impression shall bear a black and white photograph of Diana during her visit to Angola to visit an active landmine field and the surviving victims of landmines. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (i) the reverse impression shall bear a colour photograph of Diana during her visit to Angola to visit an active landmine field and the surviving victims of landmines. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;

- (j) the reverse impression shall bear a black and white photograph of Diana wearing protective gear as she walks across an active landmine field. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (k) the reverse impression shall bear a colour photograph of Diana wearing protective gear as she walks across an active landmine field. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (l) the reverse impression shall bear a black and white photograph of Diana cradling a young cancer patient during her visit to the Shaukat Khanum Hospital in Lahore, Pakistan. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (m) the reverse impression shall bear a colour photograph of Diana cradling a young cancer patient during her visit to the Shaukat Khanum Hospital in Lahore, Pakistan. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (n) the reverse impression shall bear a black and white photograph of Diana as she walked among crowds of children waving flags during her visit to Devon in September 1990. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (o) the reverse impression shall bear a colour photograph of Diana as she walked among crowds of children waving flags during her visit to Devon in September 1990. Surrounding the photograph are images of Diana's favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not' with elements from the Coat of Arms of the Spencer family. The inscription above the portrait reads 'DIEU DEFEND LE DROIT' together with the inscription 'THE PEOPLE'S PRINCESS' shown below;
- (p) the reverse impression shall bear a design depicting Diana's initial 'D' topped with a crown and surrounded by her favourite flower, the 'Forget-Me-Not, and English roses which symbolise her as 'England's Rose'.

**Legal Tender.**

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
