GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

ISSUE OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN ELIZABETH II 95TH BIRTHDAY – A LIFE IN PICTURES COLLECTION COIN NOTICE 2021

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following Notice—

Title and commencement.

1. This Notice may be cited as the Issue of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II 95th Birthday – A Life in Pictures Collection Coin Notice 2021 and comes into operation on the day of publication.

Issue of new coins.

- 2.(1) New coins of cupro nickel, silver and gold in the denominations of $\frac{1}{2}$ crown, one crown and two crowns/double crown shall be made.
- (2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.
- (3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

Design of the coins.

- 3. The design of the coins authorised by this Notice shall be as follows
 - (a) The coins shall bear on the obverse impression the effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II with the inscription "ELIZABETH II. D.G. REGINA GIBRALTAR. 2021" bordering the edge and value shown below;
 - (b) The reverse impression depicts a photograph when the Queen took her oath on June 2nd 1953. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image. At the bottom, a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE'.

- (c) The reverse impression depicts a photograph featuring a month old Princess Elizabeth with the then Duke & Duchess of York. The photograph was taken to mark her christening. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom, a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE'.
- (d) The reverse impression depicts a photograph featuring the new royal family, following the coronation of King George VI in May 1937. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE';
- (e) The reverse impression depicts a photograph featuring Princess Elizabeth, which captures her dedication to wartime duty. She became the first female member of the British Royal Family to become an active member of the British Armed Forces. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE';
- (f) The reverse impression depicts a photograph featuring Princess Elizabeth on her radio broadcast in 1947, when she pledged her future, declaring that her whole life would be devoted to service. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE';
- (g) The reverse impression depicts one of the most famous ever photograph taken of the reigning monarch when she was proclaimed 'Queen Elizabeth' aged just 25. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE';
- (h) The reverse impression depicts a photograph of the Queen when she showed her solidarity with the families of the Welsh mining village after the devastation of the Aberfan disaster in October 1966. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE';
- (i) The reverse impression depicts a photograph of the Queen riding a Royal Canadian mounted police horse called Burmese during the Trooping the Colour ceremony. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE';
- (j) The reverse impression depicts a photograph of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and her faithful consort Prince Philip. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE';

- (k) The reverse impression depicts a photograph marking a milestone in the life of the Queen Mother as they celebrated her 100th Birthday. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE';
- (l) The reverse impression depicts a photograph of a smiling Queen taken during Her Majesty's Diamond Jubilee year in 2012. The gates of Buckingham Palace border the image and at the bottom a bouquet of flowers is depicted together with a ribbon with the inscription that reads 'DEVOTED TO YOUR SERVICE';
- (m) The reverse impression features a design inspired by the 1953 Coronation crown, the first commemorative coin issued during the reign of Her Majesty Elizabeth II. The new design features the Queen on horseback, while being encircled by the shields of the nation and bordered by the flowers of a nation.

Legal Tender.

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
