## GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

### ISSUE OF THE IRELAND REMEMBRANCE - PART TWO - COLLECTION COINS NOTICE 2023

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following Notice–

#### **Title and commencement.**

1. This Notice may be cited as the Issue of the Ireland Remembrance - Part Two - Collection Coins Notice 2023 and shall come into operation on the day of publication.

#### **Issue of new coins.**

2.(1) New coins of gold in the denominations Half, One, 1/5 and 1/10, Two/Double Crowns shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

#### **Design of the coins.**

3. The design of the coins authorised by this Notice shall be as follows –

- (a) the obverse depicts the Gibraltar Coat of Arms with the inscription; GIBRALTAR, and MONTIS INSIGNIA CALPE and includes the denomination and the year in which the coin is struck. The metal and weight will also feature on the obverse of the ingots;
- (b) the reverse of the coins depicts a memorial cross in the centre, surrounded by a border of calla lilies, the Irish symbol of remembrance with the inscription ‘REMEMBER THEIR SACRIFICE’;

- (c) the reverse design depicts four Irishmen representing all the men lost in the first for independence with calla lilies to the left and right as the Irish symbol of remembrance, with the inscription ‘REMEMBER OUR MEN’;
- (d) the reverse design depicts a young woman as a symbol of remembrance to all the women who helped fight for freedom and those who sadly lost their lives for the cause of freedom with calla lilies to the left and right as Ireland’s symbol of remembrance, with the inscription ‘REMEMBER OUR WOMEN’;
- (e) the reverse design depicts a small child with ruins behind showing the devastation the war caused in Ireland and remembering the children who were not only affected but lost in the fight for freedom with calla lilies to the left and right as Ireland’s symbol of remembrance, with the inscription ‘REMEMBER OUR CHILDREN’;
- (f) the reverse design depicts a group of civilians calling for freedom in Ireland, remembering all those affected by the rebellions and wars for freedom with calla lilies to the left and right as Ireland’s symbol of remembrance, with the inscription ‘REMEMBER OUR CIVILIANS’;
- (g) the reverse of the ingot depicts a design based on the inside of Saint Patrick’s Cathedral in Dublin, where the Irish memorial service is held annually, with the inscription ‘ST PATRICK’S CATHEDRAL’.

**Legal Tender.**

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
