GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT 1990

ISSUE OF GOD SAVE THE KING COLLECTION COINS NOTICE 2023

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following Notice—

Title and commencement.

1. This Notice may be cited as the Issue of God Save the King Collection Coins Notice 2023 and shall come into operation on the day of publication.

Issue of new coins.

- 2.(1) New coins of cupro nickel, silver, gold and Nickel Brass in the denominations of a one crown, 1/25th crown, ½ crown, two/double crowns, one pound, ten pounds, twenty- five pounds, 100 Pounds, ¼ Sovereign, ½ Sovereign, one Sovereign, double Sovereign and quintuple Sovereign shall be made.
- (2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Parts I, II, VII and IX of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.
- (3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Parts of the Schedule.

Design of the coins.

- 3. The design of the coins authorised by this Notice shall be as follows
 - (a) the sovereign coins shall bear on the obverse impression the effigy of His Majesty King Charles III with the inscription "CHARLES III DEI GRA REX F.D. GIBRALTAR" bordering the top edge, date of the year below;
 - (b) the crown and pound coins shall bear on the obverse impression the effigy of His Majesty King Charles III with the inscription "CHARLES III D.G. REX F.D. GIBRALTAR" bordering the top edge, date of the year and value below;

- (c) the reverse impression shall feature the letters 'C R III' surrounded by sprigs of oak inspired by the House of Windsor crest, which symbolises strength and longevity;
- (d) the reverse impression shall bear a photographic image of His Majesty King Charles III and his wife, Queen Camilla. Surrounding the design are sprigs of oak with His Majesty's cypher at the bottom centre. The inscription reads, "LONG TO REIGN OVER US, GOD SAVE THE KING";
- (e) the reverse impression shall bear a photographic image of His Royal Highness Prince Charles as he is crowned by his mother, the late Queen Elizabeth II. Surrounding the design are sprigs of oak with His Majesty's cypher at the bottom centre. The inscription reads, "LONG TO REIGN OVER US, GOD SAVE THE KING";
- (f) the reverse impression shall bear a photographic image of His Royal Highness Prince Charles taking salute during the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo at Edinburgh Castle. Surrounding the design are sprigs of oak with His Majesty's cypher at the bottom centre. The inscription reads, "LONG TO REIGN OVER US, GOD SAVE THE KING";
- (g) the reverse impression shall bear a photographic image of His Royal Highness Prince Charles looking from a window on his fourth birthday with his mother, Queen Elizabeth II. Surrounding the design are sprigs of oak with His Majesty's cypher at the bottom centre. The inscription reads, "LONG TO REIGN OVER US, GOD SAVE THE KING";
- (h) the reverse impression shall bear a photographic image of His Royal Highness Prince Charles and her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II attending the State of Parliament in the House of Lords at the Palace of Westminster in London. Surrounding the design are sprigs of oak with His Majesty's cypher at the bottom centre. The inscription reads, "LONG TO REIGN OVER US, GOD SAVE THE KING";
- (i) the reverse impression shall bear a photographic image of His Majesty King Charles III as he signs an oath to uphold the security of the Church of Scotland during the Accession Council at St James's Palace, where he was formally proclaimed monarch. Surrounding the design are sprigs of oak with His Majesty's cypher at the bottom centre. The inscription reads, "LONG TO REIGN OVER US, GOD SAVE THE KING";
- (j) the reverse impression shall feature His Majesty King Charles III's Royal Coat of Arms. The inscription reads, "DIEU ET MON DROIT".

Legal Tender.

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
