GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

ISSUE THE BATTLE OF BRITAIN COLLECTION COIN NOTICE 2025

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following notice—

Title and commencement.

1. This notice may be cited as the Issue of the Battle of Britain Collection Coin Notice 2025 and shall come into operation on the day of publication.

Issue of new coins.

2.(1) New coins of gold in the denomination of 1/25 crowns shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

Design of the coins.

3. The design of the coins authorised by this notice shall be as follows –

- (a) the obverse depicts the new Gibraltar Coat of Arms with Latin inscription; • CHARLES III • D • G • REX • F • D • GIBRALTAR, which translates to; • CHARLES III • BY THE GRACE OF GOD • DEFENDER OF THE FAITH • KING OF GIBRALTAR and includes the denomination and the year in which the coin is struck;
- (b) the design features St. Paul's Cathedral surrounded by airplanes and with rays of light depicted in the background. St. Paul's Cathedral became a powerful symbol of British resilience and defiance. Despite heavy bombing raids by the Luftwaffe, the cathedral survived, standing tall amidst the destruction. The survival of St. Paul's was a major morale booster for the British public. It has also served as a place of remembrance and commemoration for those who fought and died in the Battle of Britain.

Legal Tender.

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
