## GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

### ISSUE OF THE YEAR OF THE THREE KINGS, COINS NOTICE 2026

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following Notice—

#### **Title and commencement.**

1. This Notice may be cited as the Issue of the Year of the Three Kings, Coins Notice 2026 and shall come into operation on the day of publication.

#### **Issue of new coins.**

2.(1) New coins of Gold and Silver, in the denominations of one crown, one eighth, quarter, half, one, two and five sovereigns, shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Parts II and VII of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

#### **Design of the coins.**

3. The design of the coins authorised by this Notice shall be as follows –

- (a) The obverse design of the sovereigns depict the effigy of King Charles III. The inscription around the edge shall read; • CHARLES III • DEI • GRA • REX • F • D • GIBRALTAR • together with the year shown below;
- (b) The obverse design of the crowns depict the effigy of King Charles III. The inscription around the edge shall read; • CHARLES III • D • G • REX • F • D • GIBRALTAR • together with the denomination and year shown below;
- (c) The reverse design depicts an image of George V facing Big Ben, the clock showing the time that he passed away. The Flowers of a Nation are depicted below to the right. The inscription at the top edge reads ‘YEAR OF THREE KINGS’;

- (d) The reverse design depicts an image of Edward VIII facing Big Ben, the clock showing the time that he formally announced his abdication on radio. The Flowers of a Nation are depicted below to the right. The inscription at the top edge reads 'YEAR OF THREE KINGS';
- (e) The reverse design depicts an image of George VI facing Big Ben, the clock showing the time the process of regalia began in his coronation. The Flowers of a Nation are depicted below to the right. The inscription at the top edge reads 'YEAR OF THREE KINGS'.

**Legal Tender.**

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
