LEGAL NOTICE NO. 106 OF 2026

GIBRALTAR COINAGE ACT, 1990

ISSUE OF THE 110TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE EASTER RISING PART TWO, COINS NOTICE 2026

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2 of the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990, and of all other enabling powers, the Minister responsible for finance has issued the following Notice—

Title and commencement.

1. This Notice may be cited as the Issue of the 110th Anniversary of the Easter Rising Part Two, Coins Notice 2026 and shall come into operation on the day of publication.

Issue of new coins.

2.(1) New coins of Gold, in the denominations of 1/10 Crown, shall be made.

(2) In the making of the said coins, the millesimal fineness or composition of metals, diameters, shapes and other specifications shall be as set out in Part II of the Schedule to the Gibraltar Coinage Act, 1990.

(3) In the making of the said coins, a remedy (that is a variation from the standard weight) shall be allowed as set out in the said Part of the Schedule.

Design of the coins.

3. The design of the coins authorised by this Notice shall be as follows –

- (a) The obverse design depicts the Gibraltar Castle Coat of Arms with the inscription; "GIBRALTAR" and "MONTIS INSIGNIA CALPE" together with the denomination and the year in which the coin is struck;
- (b) The reverse design shall bear an image of Padraig Pearse reading out the Proclamation of the Irish Republic in front of the General Post Office on O'Connell Street, Dublin, Ireland, with the inscription bordering the edge of the coin and surrounding the image "DAY 1 • PROCLAMATION" and "DAY 2 • MARTIAL LAW";
- (c) The reverse design shall bear an image of Mount Street Bridge and, in the background, smoke coming from the General Post Office on O'Connell Street, Dublin, Ireland, with the inscription, bordering the edge of the coin and

surrounding the image, "DAY 3 • MOUNT STREET BRIDGE DEFENCE" and "DAY 4• BOMBARDMENT CONTINUES"; and

- (d) The reverse design shall bear an image of Irish volunteers evacuating the General Post Office on O'Connell Street, Dublin, Ireland which burns in the background, and an image of the hand of Padraig Pearse signing the unconditional surrender document in the foreground which bears the word "SURRENDER", with the inscription, bordering the edge of the coin and surrounding the image, "DAY 5 • EVACUATION TO MOORE STREET" and "DAY 6 • SURRENDER".

Legal Tender.

4. The said coins shall be current and legal tender in Gibraltar.
