#### INFECTIOUS DISEASES ORDER

The provisions of Part IV of the Ordinance relating to the notification of disease apply to the following infectious diseases:—

Acute Encephalitis

Acute Poliomyelitis

Chicken Pox

Epidemic Parotitis (Mumps)

Erysipelas

Lassa Fever

Leprosy

Marburg Disease

Measles

Meningococcal Infection

Ophthalmia Neonatorum

Paratyphoid Fever

Pertussis (whooping Cough)

Puerperal Fever

Rabies

Relapsing Fever

Rubella (German Measles)

Trachoma

Tuberculosis (all forms)

Venereal disease

Viral Haemorrhagic Fever

and those diseases are notifiable diseases to which the provisions of the Ordinance relating to notifiable diseases apply.

This Order does not apply where a person suffering from venereal disease is under specific and adequate treatment, and by reason of habits, condition of life and residence is unlikely to spread the disease.

The provisions of sections 155, 156, 165 and 166 of the Ordinance do not apply to tuberculosis.
